Here are a couple of possible journeys to get you started on your plan.

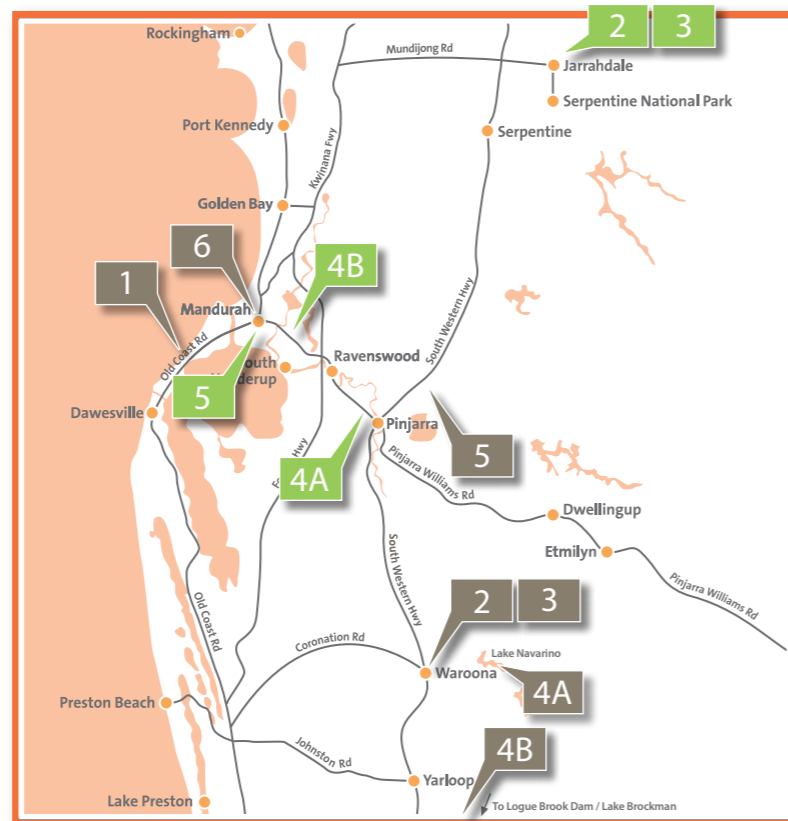
Journey 1: Caravan & Camping

1 WATERFRONT HOLIDAY PARK

Begin your stay at the leafy Miami Holiday Park, Mandurah's only waterfront caravan park. You'll have direct access to the estuary for boating and fishing. In the morning, get breakfast at the nearby Miami Bakehouse before heading south to Waroona or north to the Jarrahdale trails.

SOUTH FROM MIAMI

2 ANTIQUES AND COLLECTABLES

Visit the antique store in Waroona that stocks one of the best collections of china and collectables in Western Australia, as well as a vast array of exquisite Moorcroft pottery.

3 WAROONA HERITAGE TRAIL

Look out for markers for the heritage walk that visit many of the town's historical sites and buildings. Local artists have provided sketches of the sites as they once were, and these form the basis for the trail.

4 LAKE NAVARINO / LOGUE BROOK DAM

Paddle a canoe on the glassy waters of Lake Navarino in Waroona (A). Or visit Logue Brook Dam (B), where you can take a dip in the tantalising water, water-ski or canoe, or take in the natural beauty on a bushwalk along part of the Bibbulmun Track.

5 TRANQUIL BUSHLAND STAY

Stay in the welcoming, village-style accommodation at Fairbridge, Pinjarra. The heritage-listed cottages are surrounded by beautiful bushland, and features include a 30m pool, volleyball, tennis, basketball, an art gallery, a museum, gas barbecues, an accessible playground, a café and several hiking trails.

6 DOLPHIN CRUISE AND DINNER

For a final adventure, experience a delightful dolphin cruise in Mandurah with Mandurah Cruises. Round out your visit in the evening with dinner at the award-winning Café Pronto, open seven days a week.

NORTH FROM MIAMI

2 PUB LUNCH

Stop for lunch at the Jarrahdale Tavern, known as 'the Irish pub in the hills'. Have a delicious pub meal before hitting the trails.

3 JARRAHDAL TRAILS

The Jarrahdale area is crisscrossed by a variety of fascinating trails through the bushland hills. Take your pick of horse riding trails, walking trails or mountain biking trails amongst the wonderful wildlife and wildflowers.

4 CARAVAN PARK

Spend the night at Pinjarra Caravan Park (A) or Mandurah Caravan Park (B). Both leafy parks are well-equipped, with pools, chalets, and sites for tents or caravans. Pinjarra also has an adjacent golf course, and wonderful wildlife, including kangaroos that frequent the shady areas.

5 DOLPHIN CRUISE AND DINNER

For a final adventure, experience a delightful dolphin cruise in Mandurah with Mandurah Cruises. Round out your refreshing holiday with a mouth-watering seafood dinner as the sun sets over Mandjar Bay.
